


FRIDAY 15th DECEMBER – IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LUNCHES THAT DAY FOR KS2

Extra information about the learning this week.

Year 1 - This week in Year 1 we have been learning to describe 2D shapes using mathematical vocabulary. We played a game and asked our partners questions about a mystery shape. We asked questions such as 'Does the shape have 4 equal sides? or 'Does the shape have 4 vertices?. We also designed our own pictures using 2D shapes.

Year 2 have really enjoyed their recent study on Ants, learning and writing some brilliant facts. We also loved welcoming parents in for our minibeast clay workshop and look forward to hosting more of these events in the future.

Year 3: We had an excellent topic workshop with parents and carers this week. The children are very proud of their amazing Viking longboat creations. Thank you to all grown-ups who were able to join us for our arty afternoon. Take a look at our school Twitter page for some photos!

Year 4 This week in Year 4 we have been lucky enough to have a zoom session with The Polar Museum in Cambridge and another zoom session with an explorer, Mr Avery. We learnt about how polar exploration equipment may or may not have changed over the years.

In Science, we have learnt about the food chains of the rainforest, and, in maths, we have continued with last week's work on multiplicative reasoning. SCHOOL LUNCH PRICE RISE

The cost of school lunch is increasing from 1st January 2024 from £2.40 to £2.53. Children in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 will continue to receive universal free school lunches. Pupils in Years 3,4,5 and 6 eligible for Pupil Premium will also receive free school dinners. All these people do have to order lunches on SELECT even though they are free.

The school (funded by DFE) will pay the increase for these meals for those children but all other pupils must pay the £2.53.

ASPENS the catering company have put up their price in line with increase to the minimum wage from £10.42 to £11.44 and the higher cost of food.

We are so fortunate that Adam and his team at St Francis produce delicious meals with this rather small budget.
