Learning in school this week

Year 1 We had a wonderful time on our school trip to Gressenhall. We visited a Victorian schoolhouse, post office, shop and home. We loved spotting Victorian artefacts during the trip and the adults were impressed at how knowledgeable we were! We got to experience the life of a Victorian child by playing with Victorian toys, polishing the copperware, making drop scones on the hearth and helping with the laundry (which was hard work before electricity

Year 2 This week, Year 2 have thoroughly enjoyed learning about Celtic warrior queen Boudicca! We have learned about her successes in battle, have begun collages by creating careful pencil drawings and learned songs telling stories about her life.

Year 3 enjoyed 52 Day on Monday, where they explored everything linked to the number 52, including how to represent 52 in different ways and writing lists of 52 verbs, 52 adjectives and 52 nouns! 52 day introduced our new topic of Latitude 52. The children are really looking forward to exploring Norwich, Canada and China for the remainder of the year.

Year 4 In Year 4 this week we have enjoyed creating our own list poems about "Ten things..." We have had poems about 'Ten things'... under the bed, at the back of the fridge, at the bottom of my mum's handbag and in the shed at the bottom of the garden! They've made for very interesting reading.
