LEARNING THIS WEEK

Year 1 This week in Year 1 we have continued recording the growth of our beans in our bean diaries. Some have reached 23cm already! We are learning to be patient as some are growing slower than others! In RE we have learnt about the Holy Trinity. In Maths we have been sharing amounts into equal groups.

Year 2 have have been working really hard growing their understanding of fractions this week, looking at how they can be found in shapes and numbers. This has required a lot of mathematical creativity and resilience, leaving all the classroom adults really impressed. We have also enjoyed continuing our learning about computer programming by designing routes and de-bugging algorithms we have created on Beebots!

Year 3 children have been learning about how Jesus ascended into heaven but gave his Apostles the task of spreading the Good News about Jesus's life, death and Resurrection. One important aspect of how the early churches remembered Jesus was by celebrating Mass. They found out what has to be laid on the Altar for Mass, the purpose of the items and how the bread and wine become Jesus' body and blood. This also supports the preparation any children making their First Holy Communion soon will be learning.

Year 4 We have now finished our rosary pouches so they will soon be coming home for the children to put their own rosary beads in. Tucked inside their pouch will be their beautifully handwritten prayer that we studied on our Mary, Celebration Day. The children are very proud, as are we, of their creative textile project. We hope you are impressed too!

Year 5 This week in Maths, we have started working with decimal numbers. In English, we are exploring the character of Tim in the poem, The Highwayman by Alfred Noyes. Ask your child whether they think he was guilty or not?! In History, we have been discovering which of the Tudors was the most brutal!

Year 6 has worked incredibly hard this week. They have shown super teamwork skills in Maths and English with their revision. They have continued to produce some excellent 3D modelling work in computing, developing their skills and ideas further. We hope all of Year 6 have a restful and enjoyable weekend ahead of SATs next week.
